#### II. Approval of Agenda

Motion by Dave Collier, seconded by Sarah Sandbak, that the Board approves the agenda.

#### III. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

#### IV. Approval of Prior Minutes

#### A. February 27, 2024 Meeting

Motion, by Eric Hoffman, seconded by Juliana Wayman, that the minutes from the February 27, 2024 meeting be approved.

Motion passed, unopposed.

#### V. AUSF Remittance and Distribution Report

Board Vice President Steve Kramer asked Ms. Bernier to present the February 2024 AUSF Remittance and Distribution Report.

Ms. Bernier proceeded to lead a brief review of the current disbursements and the distribution shortage. She noted that the remittances were higher this month due to receiving outstanding remittances for the prior month.

The remittances received this month were higher than the support shortage for the oldest period resulting in full payment of the August 2023 support shortage and a partial payment of the September 2023 support shortage. Support shortage payment details can be found on page 15 of the report.

The support funds are scheduled to be distributed on March 29. 2024. A copy of the distribution report was included in the packet labeled V.

Motion, by Juliana Wayman, seconded by Sarah Sandbak, that the Board approves the February 2024 AUSF Remittance and Distribution Report and authorizes the distribution of funds on or about March 29, 2024 in the amount of \$1,199,809.17.

Motion passed, unopposed.

#### VI. Agent Report

Board Vice President Steve Kramer asked Ms. Bernier to present the monthly administrative report, along with the financial reports for February. Ms. Bernier provided a copy of the report with her presentation.

There were two items for the Board to consider, the invoice from AECA for February 2024 services and the invoices from Erickson & Brooks for the final billing of the compliance review of 2021.

#### **BOARD ACTION REQUEST #1:**

Motion, by Dave Collier, seconded by Juliana Wayman that the Board approve payment for invoice number 345, from AECA, for February 2024 administrative services for a total of \$6,567.24.

#### A. AUSAC Board Officer Elections

Ms. Bernier presented that the AUSAC Board currently has a vacancy for the President position which Vice President Steve Kramer has been filling in for. The Board nomination docket was taken up at a recent RCA public meeting where the RCA accepted the nominations.

Ms. Bernier provided a brief review of each of the Board officer duties and opened nominations for the AUSAC Board President position. The Board elected to start with nominations for Secretary Treasurer.

Motion, by Juliana Wayman, seconded by Laura Kompkoff that the Board nominate Eric Hoffman to serve as the AUSAC Secretary Treasurer.

Motion, by Sarah Sandbak, seconded by Laura Kompkoff that the Board nominate Juliana Wayman to serve as the AUSAC President.

Motion passed, unopposed.

Motion, by Juliana Wayman, seconded by Sarah Sandbak that the Board nominate Steve Kramer to serve as the AUSAC Vice President.

#### VIII. New Business

#### A. D&O Insurance Renewal

Ms. Bernier presented a review of the D&O insurance renewal. She noted that the renewal qualified for automatic renewal and is approximately \$300 higher than the prior year with no changes to the policy. Ms. Bernier notified the broker regarding the reduced AUSF support and budget changes and received a response that the underwriter will review the financials at the next renewal. The are sufficient funds in the 2024 operating budget and the payment structure would continue with monthly installment payments.

Motion, by Laura Kompkoff, seconded by Eric Hoffman that the Board approve the D&O policy renewal.

# Summary

We appoint directors to the Alaska Universal Service Administrative Company (AUSAC) Board of Directors. The chairman addresses the timeline for decision, designates a Commission Panel and Commission Docket Manager, and appoints an administrative law judge. We close this docket.

#### Discussion

AUSAC submitted the nominations of Eric Hoffman, Sarah Sandbak, and Laura Kompkoff for consideration and appointment to the Board of Directors for AUSAC.<sup>1</sup>

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Hoffman was nominated for appointment to represent the Interexchange Carriers group and to fill the AUSAC Board seat vacated by the resignation of Lisa Philips, who had previously been appointed to this position with a term ending February 2023.<sup>2</sup>

Sandbak was nominated for reappointment to represent the Wireless Group Carriers (Commercial Mobile Radio Services or Personal Communication Services (CMRS/PCS) Carriers).<sup>3</sup> Sandbak had previously been appointed to this position with a term ending February 2024.4

Kompkoff was nominated for reappointment to represent Other Group Carriers (CMRS/PCS Carriers – Members Not Otherwise Represented). 5 Kompkoff had previously been appointed to this position with a term ending February 2024.6

This order documents our action taken at the public meeting held February 14, 2024, where we considered the nominations and appointed Hoffman, Sandbak, and Kompkoff as directors.<sup>7</sup> The consideration of appointment at our public meeting took place within thirty days of AUSAC filing the nominations with the Commission. Our action on the nominations and the issuance of this order is within the 180-day statutory timeline for issuance of a final order addressing an initiating petition identified in AS 42.05.175(i).

# Decision Timeline

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The Commission is required by AS 42.05.175(i) to issue a final order no later than 180 days after a nomination is filed. Accordingly, we issue this order in this proceeding before the date of July 27,2024.

#### Commission Panel

The chairman designates Commissioners John Espindola, Keith Kurber II, and Robert M. Pickett and himself as the Commission Panel.8 The chairman further designates John Espindola as the Commission Docket Manager.

#### Administrative Law Judge

Under AS 42.04.070(b), the chairman appoints Administrative Law Judge Nolan S. Oliver to facilitate conduct of the docket. Orders issued by the administrative law judge will be considered orders of the Commission for purposes of petitions for reconsideration.

#### Final Order

This order constitutes the final decision in this proceeding. This decision may be appealed within thirty days of this order in accordance with AS 22.10.020(d) and Alaska Rule of Appellate Procedure 602(a)(2). In addition to the appellate rights afforded by AS 22.10.020(d), a party has the right to file a petition for reconsideration in accordance with 3 AAC 48.105. If such a petition is filed, the time period for filing an appeal is tolled and then recalculated in accordance with Alaska Rule of Appellate Procedure 602(a)(2).

#### **Docket Closure**

No substantive or procedural matters remain in this proceeding. Accordingly, we close this docket.

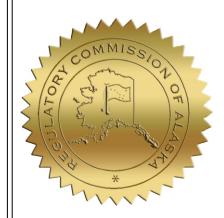

- 101. GENERAL. Charges for each access element shall be computed and assessed as provided in Sections 101 119. For nonpooling, incumbent LECs with more than one study area, initial rates and price ceilings shall be computed on a study area basis unless otherwise authorized by the Commission.
- 102. PRICE CEILINGS FOR NONPOOLING LECs. A LEC exiting the pool shall initially compute all charges in Sections 108 115 using the most recent company specific access revenue requirement and demand approved by the Commission. The initial rate for a rate element calculated in Sections 104, 106, 107, 111, 112, 114, and 118 for nonpooling LECs will establish a price ceiling for that rate element in the incumbent's study area. The price ceiling applies to the access rates for all LECs providing access service in the incumbent's study area. Modification of rates below the price ceiling is permitted by nonpooling companies in accordance with Section 116.

- 104. ESSENTIAL NETWORK SUPPORT FOR NONPOOLING COMPANIES. (a) A monthly Essential Network Support (ENS) charge shall be determined each month by dividing the nonpooling company annual ENS by twelve. The Essential Network Support for each nonpooling company is determined pursuant to 3 AAC 53.346.
- (b) The monthly ENS billing, as calculated in accordance with subdivision (a), shall be transmitted to the Alaska Universal Service Administrative Company (AUSAC) on a form specified by AUSAC.
- 105. ESSENTIAL NETWORK SUPPORT FOR POOLING COMPANIES. (a) A monthly ENS charge shall be determined each month by dividing the pooling company annual ENS by twelve. The ENS for each pooling company is determined pursuant to 3 AAC 53.346.
- (b) The monthly ENS billing, as calculated in accordance with subdivision (a), shall be transmitted to the AUSAC on a form specified by AUSAC.
- 106. LOCAL SWITCHING. (a) Charges that are expressed in dollars and cents per access minute of use shall be assessed upon all interexchange carriers that use local exchange switching facilities for the provision of intrastate interexchange services.
- (b) For pooling companies, a per minute charge shall be computed by dividing the annual revenue requirement for the Local Switching element of pooling companies by the pooled companies' annual access minutes of use for all intrastate interexchange services that use local exchange switching facilities.
- (c) For nonpooling areas, an initial per minute charge shall be computed by dividing the incumbent's revenue requirement for the Local Switching element by the corresponding demand units for that rate element. The access charge revenue requirement and demand units used to compute the initial rate shall be the revenue requirement and demand units most recently approved by the Commission.
- 107. EQUAL ACCESS. (a) A monthly charge that is expressed in dollars and cents per presubscribed equal access line shall be established and assessed in equal access exchanges upon all interexchange carriers for the presubscribed equal access lines the carrier serves.
- (b) A monthly charge per presubscribed equal access line specific to each telephone company providing equal access shall be computed by dividing each telephone company's annual revenue requirement for the Equal Access element by twelve times the annual average number

- The possibility of new variants in the continuing Covid-19 pandemic presents a risk of project delays due to infection in either the Queryon or AUSAC teams.
- Turnover of key staff. Any turnover of key project staff could result in a delay of the project schedule and increase in project cost due to retraining and/or schedule slip.
- This estimate is subject to change based on security considerations, testing requirements, technical stack decisions related to Azure, and other unknown factors.

#### **CONSTRAINTS**

• Due to the ongoing risk of Covid-19 outbreaks, all project activities must be able to be completed remotely in the event of a shutdown.



# 7.0 OUT OF SCOPE

Queryon considers the following elements and deliverables to be out of scope for this project:

- Any items not discussed above are considered out of scope. A change order can be provided for any new development beyond the troubleshooting tasks.
- The scope outlined in this document does not include extensive documentation, unit testing or formal training. A change order can be provided to scope out any of these items.
